NO LATEX PAINT **ACCEPTED!**



Air dry liquid latex paint in the can by removing the lid. To speed up this process, you can mix sand, cement, plaster of paris or kitty litter with the paint. Once dried, you can dispose of your dried paint/can with your garbage.

Materials NOT Accepted

The following materials will not be accepted at the clean sweep event:

Prescription Medications, Explosives (ammunition, fireworks, etc.), Human Medical & Biological Wastes, Infectious Wastes, Household Sharps, Latex Paints, (non-lead based), Radioactive Materials (Smoke Detectors), Compressed Gas Cylinders, Shock or Heat Sensitive Materials such as Ether, Peroxide or Picric Acid, Recyclable Motor Oil, Fertilizer, Tires, Asbestos, Anti-Freeze, or Alkaline Batteries (throw alkaline batteries in your trash!)

CLEAN SWEEP GUIDELINES

- Farms & households may bring any amount of hazardous waste for free disposal.
- Small Business & Schools must contact Veolia with completed inventory list
- Materials should be properly identified with their original labels.
- ◆ **DO NOT MIX** materials together. Doing so can be extremely dangerous!
- Pack materials for your safety. Place materials in a cardboard box lined with a plastic bag. Separate each product with a folded newspaper.
- If a container is leaking, put it into a secondary leak-proof container.
- Pack containers in the trunk of your vehicle, away from the driver, passengers and pets.
- Unknown materials can be brought in, but Richland County and its hazardous waste disposal contractor reserve the right to refuse any material.
- ♦ NEVER LEAVE HAZARDOUS WASTES AT ANY LOCATION. ABANDONING HAZARDOUS WASTES, EVEN FROM HOUSEHOLDS, IS A <u>STATE & FEDERAL</u> <u>OFFENSE</u>

CLEAN SWEEP

Clean Sweep is a limited time collection of unwanted, unused or damaged agricultural or household hazardous wastes and pharmaceuticals. This program collects, treats, stores, or disposes of waste in an environmentally safe method through a licensed hazardous waste facility. Hazardous wastes can usually be identified by products labels which contain any of the following words:

Caution, Warning, Danger, Poison, Toxic, Ignitable or Flammable, Acid, Corrosive or Reactive.



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- ⇒ All residents are eligible to participate.
- ⇒ Farms, schools and businesses need to pre-register.
- ⇒ Household Clean Sweep items must be taken to location given at those times given.
- ⇒ Pharmaceuticals Contact Richland Center Police Department

VERY SMALL QUANTITY GENERATOR (VSQG) PROGRAM

A VSQG is a small business or school that generates less than 2,205 lbs., of legally defined hazardous waste.

Small businesses & schools can take advantage of the lower collection and disposal rates negotiated by the state of Wisconsin for household and agricultural hazardous waste collection programs. Agricultural small businesses are also eligible to receive a 50% cost share from state pesticide funds, lowering the cost even more.
